## class information

All classes meet TUESDAY through FRIDAY at the Salina Art Center, 242 S. Santa Fe.

**Preschool-kindergarten classes** are for children who are at least 4 years old and for those up to age 6 who have just completed kindergarten. Each class lasts one hour daily. See schedule for dates and times.

**Elementary classes** are divided into *First-Second Grade students*, those who have just completed first or second grades, and *Third-Fifth Grade students* who have just completed third, fourth, or fifth grades. Classes meet for 2 or 2 ½ hours daily. See schedule for dates and times.

**Middle School classes** are for students who have just completed sixth, seventh, or eighth grades. Classes meet for 2 hours daily. See schedule for dates and times.

**Adult classes** are offered to those who have completed at least one year of high school.

To provide safety and age-appropriate activities, NO EXCEPTIONS will be made to the grade and age designations above. Class sizes are limited in order to provide high-quality art experiences.

Enrollment for classes begins May 4. Walk-in registration begins May 11. Registration forms are provided in the Parks & Recreation Summer Activities Guide. You must enroll through the Salina Parks and Recreation process. All policies regarding payment of fees, waiting lists, refunds, and fee waivers will follow Parks and Recreation guidelines detailed on pages 4 and 5 of the Summer Activities Guide.
